Forklift jib cranes fit onto the forklift by inserting two forks into the fork pockets. The rear of the jib crane then seats against the back of the fork and a safety chain wraps the forklift carriage to hold it into place.

The load capacity of a forklift jib has a most of about 1935 lbs to as much as 6000 lbs on either the extended or retracted positions range. Vital pointers whenever utilizing an adjustable jib is to never pull a load using this particular sort of accessory. These types of additions are only used for vertical lifting. Also, avoid letting the load move backward and forward. Use extreme caution each and every time a load is carried to avoid tipping over the truck.
